The goals of the data workshop are to compile life history information, abundance indices, and catch statistics; evaluate and critique available datasets; provide data for assessment analyses, and draft the data workshop reports. Much of the workshop will be devoted to workgroup sessions where data will be compiled and documented. Plenary sessions to resolve issues will be scheduled as needed based on group progress. Consensus recommendations should be available at the end of the workshop.
